

How old are you?










I feel the worship at my parish draws me into a deeper relationship with God. 1,101 responses




I currently travel to a different parish, separate from my home parish, to attend a Mass at a more convenient time.




On the weekend, Mass is the highest priority for me and my family.







Do I understand that through my baptism I am called to be a disciple of Jesus Christ? 1,089 responses




My parish has adequate opportunities to help its parishioners grow in love and knowledge of the Faith.








I feel comfortable to invite people to Mass.






I feel that my parish serves my local community well.




I am aware of opportunities within my parish to serve those in need.




Do I practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy in my daily life? 1,080 responses




Do I take advantage of serving at Mass as a Usher, Greeter, Lector, Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, etc.?






My parish is welcoming to its parishioners and those visiting.











# **Next Steps**
